Howard gestures expansively

Michele says, "Hi, Howard."

Butoh says, "Hello! We are waiting for a few more poeple to arrive. You text is on the slates (virtual communities)."

Butoh prostrates.

Howard says, "Hi Michele! This must be your home cyberspace.;-)"

Michele nods. This & Jay's House...

Michele has been spending a lot of time in cyberspace lately.

Butoh lives in cyberspace (and has to pay for it as well).

Howard says, "No sense waiting, right? Anybody want to get this rolling?"

Butch says, "The symposium in Graz with Kit Galloway is trying to connect to us as well."

Butoh says, "Sure."

Butoh says, "I am going to switch systems.and start"

Howard says, "Butoh, remind me of who will be conneting from where..."

Butoh says, "OK, I'll let you know as they connect. David Blair is here, as is

Mike Stubbs of Time Based Arts in Hull/UK."

Butoh says, "Heather Barton of Melbourne (media theoreticain) is also here." Howard says, "Butoh, you and David and Mike and Michele are at the physical Media Lab now?"

Butoh says, "There are about 30 other people who all went out to eat and are supposed to be back by now."

Howard says, "Heather are you one of the Guests?"

Butoh says, "No, we are in Vienna."

Michele is the only one in Boston, actually.

Howard says, "Helps to get my map straight!"

Michele nods.

Butoh says, "She is not logged in. We only have three net connections. I will be typing for everyone."

Howard says, "What's happening in Vienna?"

Butch says, "evryone is now throwing snowballs at the windows. I think they are back from eating."

Howard says, "I'm interested in the state of computer-mediated communication in Austria and Germany. I know a little about France and England. Can anybody say something about virtual communities in Europe?"

Butoh says, "The \*real\* forum has about 100 chairs and a video beamer, plus three monitors. We have three net connections."

Butoh says, "OK, the crowd is stariting to come in now."

Howard says, "Are we waiting for a quorum? Does anybody have a question? Should I just start blathering?"

Butoh says, "Yes, there are several questions. I am just waiting for everyone to get in.'

Michele [to Butoh]: Maybe you should start asking now, so that Howard can start typing replies.

Butoh says, "Do you see VC's as being very seperate from real life communities?"

Howard says, "I think we need to look at a finer level of specificity to answer that. I think that you can have a virtual community in which people create value among themselves and who do reach out to each other in a human way, even if they never meet in person. Azure\_Guest says, "hello patrick, yes i just got the physical body fed and watered, and can now join this cyberspace discussion."

Max has arrived.

Howard says, "I think that word fools us a lot because it does have so many connotations to some kind of -- is reified the right word? -- ideal world. We could say "online community" and ask the same questions without those connotations."

You say, "I agree, I think the word virtual has caused a lot of confusion."

Howard peers into the darkness, trying to see who is participating in this...

You say, "That was me (Butoh)."

You say, "People are still coming in to the physical UnitN room."

Howard says, "Something IS happening at the grass roots, all over the world, that is worth our attention."

You say, "Butoh asks if Howard thinks that this has to do with the new "spirituality" movement (ie New Age)?"

Azure\_Guest says, "Grass roots networking is one of the objectives of the Associ ation for Progressive Communications. Their objective is more to engage creative e debate on issues such as environmental and peace activism rather than using the enew medium for artistic expression. I had a long discussion with Carl Loeffler on this point at a network conference in korea recently."

Blue\_Guest materializes out of thin air.

Howard says, "There are some people who do use CMC very effectively as part of building spiritual community -- Peter and Trudy Johnson-Lenz"

I see no "azure-guest" here.

Blue Guest says, "i am so confused (i will sit here 'n listen)..."

You say, "I think that the artistic part of networking is just as important as he peace/environmental issues."

Azure\_Guest says, "Howard, what do you mean by spiritual? Without getting into an alt.magick style debate, it can be argued that every area of human endeavour \_can\_ be spiritual. As for art, that is definitely an area where human beings can express their spiritual impulses. And all art (IMHO) is essentially communicative."

Howard says, "It isn't so much political activism RATHER than art -- I think the same tool serves different communities. One thing that has surprised me from my research is that I started out interested in the personal and social-cultural parts of virtual communities -- because that is what I experience in my own life that turns me on -- but I am ending up realizing that right now, the POLITICAL potential of the medium is the most important aspect to attend to. Politics trumps everything else. If we lose control of our freedom to communicate like this, either to governments or big business, you can forget about artistic expression."

Blue Guest says, "i was about to say (forgive me -- i am confused) "art 'n networking"..."

You say, "Without the polictics there would be no networks. I think that is definately an important point."

Howard says, "And I'm NOT very political person. It's just that I've tried to do a good job fighuring out what this all means, and what it means is that a thousand flowers are blooming now, but it is VERY possible that somebody will succeed in seizing, censoring, metering, and selling us this medium."

Blue Guest has disconnected.

You say, "More or less in a Prodigy type setting. The question I think is who will "rule" these virtual communities."

Howard says, "Didn't mean to drop the spiritual thread. I'm not on solid ground there. About 4 years ago, I set up New Zealand's first public access USEnet/Internet system, although we charge, because we don't have any money. "

Howard says, "At the municipal and regional level, you have the opportunity to use the online community-building to leverage and stimulate action in the real world where the participants live. At the same time, the locals can have access to Usenet and to other systems in other parts of the world -- I see that as a very exciting positive vision."

Howard says, "I think the Freenets and other municipal systems are reaching a point where it would be extremely valuable for representatives to think of getting together face to face somewhere in the world."

Howard says, "I don't think most of the people who use this medium in Japan, Taiwan, Korea, would consider themselves "white." Most of them are male."

You say, "But African-American issues written by African-Americans?"

Max says, "well I would gues that is an important reason there should be terminals in public libraries, both in the cities, and in rural areas."

You say, "Good point. Is it important. I think getting evryone online if the want access is important, not what class etc they are from."

Howard says, "How do you know? The point is that racial issues only come into play here when the topic of discussion has a racial or ethnic content."

Howard says, "Equity of access is a class issue."

Michele :to Howard:: When referring to friendships formed over the net, are you talking primarly through email, which is a relativly non-anonymous medium, or also to environments like MUDs, which may be more or less anonymous?

You say, "The friendships I (Butoh) have formed through the net have been through various lists and through private e-mail."

Howard says, "I'm talking mostly about conferencing systems, BBSs, etc, where there is both a private and public component. Certainly people form strong bonds in MUDs despite the anonymity."

Michele notes that she has no idea what race some of her netfriends from MOOs are, unless they have told her. Gender is also the choice of the character in a MOO. She's not sure how true that is for non-anoymous systems. fairly un-anonymous.

You say, "I think MUD's are fairly un-anonymous."

You say, "The WELL's You Own Your Own Words idea for example. Very un-anonymous."

Howard says, "Equity of access is a political and economic issue. We MUST educate people about what all this means, or somebody is going to SELL what should be provided as a public good. Don't forget -- American taxayers paid for the development of networking, as a WEAPON (a command and control system for nuclear combat)"

Max is david blair

You say, "Mike Stubbs says "Yeah, absolutley!"."

You say, "I think we need to get these systems away from businesses and schools and out in the public."

Howard says, "Elizabeth Reid raises the interesting point that on IRC you don't have to know who is behind an identity, but the community requires that identities remain stable -- hence, Nickservs that keep IRC chatters from using the same nicks."

You say, "Could you explain nicks?"

Max says, "excuse my hash.... newuser.... I think that access comes...."

Howard says, "Nicks are stable pseuds on IRC, which means you might never know that Blue Meanie is an identifiable person somewhere, but you know that Blue Meanie today is the same person that was Blue Meanie yesterday."

You say, "Oh, a kind of protection of chrareter identity."

Howard says, "Friends, I am going to have to go soon. If you want to get in touch, please send email to me hlr@well.sf.ca.us I can stick around for a few more minutes."

You say, "Great Howard, thanks a lot for the time!"

Azure\_Guest smiles and waves at everyone.

Max says, "thanks for your time, Howard."

Howard says, "It's hard to have a community without stable identities, even if you don't know who they connect with in t he real world. You need to know who you can trust to provide reliable information, and who you can't trust. This leads into the whole hairy area of disintermediation."

Howard says, "See you all later, somewhere...."

You say, "Herwig Turk wonders if there have been any major events organized purely over the nets (ie art festivals)."

Azure\_Guest looks around for the exit, edging towards the far corner of the room. He stops and picks up a drink from the table, then disappears in a puff of logic

Howard waves

Howard has disconnected.
