

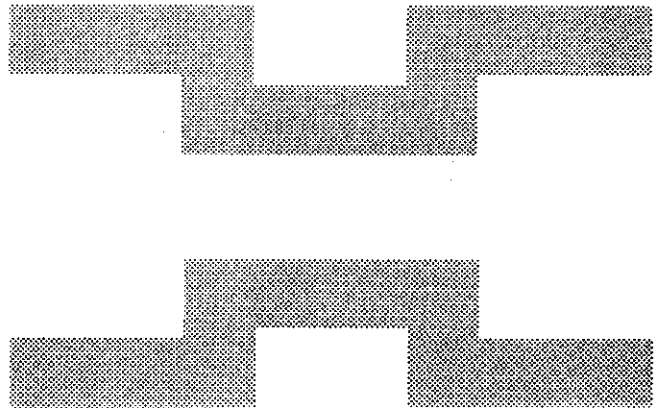


La Galerie Souterraine project HILUS (Blake, Kossatz, Meierhofer, Turk)

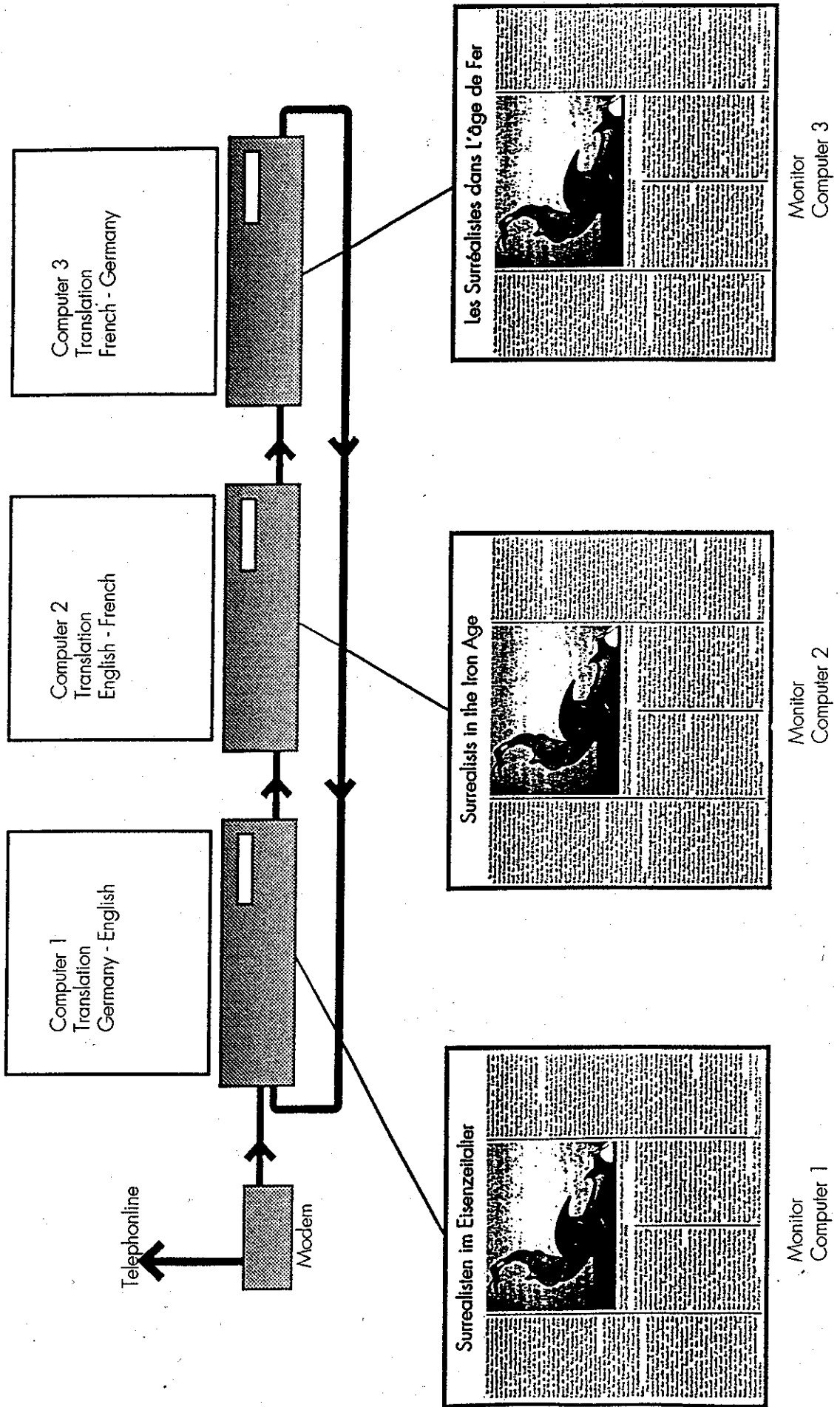
Installation of three computers/monitors where a text and picture are showing (or some combination of a text and image). The text originates from either an electronic bulletin board (e.g. CompuServe) or an ordinary daily newspaper and is then successively translated by the computer into different languages. As a result of the translation from German into French, French into English, English into German, etc., inaccuracy will increasingly alter the content over time. The image in the picture - remaining unchanged as a graphic representation - will consequently be redefined as well.

The plan is to load the computers daily, via the electronic network, with new articles on exhibitions, performances and similar events reported by and about galleries. The translation will be executed automatically by the computers all day long. Results will be stored and may be read, compared, analyzed and printed afterwards.

The idea of the project is to represent the gallery space as a semantic construction, internationally communicated and mediated.

Kit Blake

Kit Blake is a media artist living in Brooklyn, USA. His sculptural work - primarily installations - carries on an examination of the juncture between art and media. It focuses on the information technologies - satellites, computers, lasers - and the social transformation they engender.

Periodically he curates, his most recent project being a thirty artist group show of interactive work, Tweaking the Human, co-curated with Roxy (Middendorf) Paine.

He is also the editor/publisher of WORM, a semi-annual magazine of cultural observation and media commentary.

WORM is created on a Macintosh, and he uses the desktop publishing software to create image-based works which follow similar directions.

He also writes essays in various publications and catalogs which explore media theory.

Max Kossatz

Max Kossatz produces and creates commercial (for TV broadcast stations) and artistic computeranimations (e.g. participation in "Kettenanimation/chain animation")

Furthermore he constructs and programs control systems for interactive installations and presentations.

In 1992 he founded the union HILUS, association for intermedia project research, in collaboration with Herwig Turk, Christine Meierhofer, Reinhard Braun, Christoph Nebel. HILUS organized the festival UNITⁿ.

In addition he explores all sorts of telecommunication (via INTERNET, electronic mail boxes, fax etc.) and their impact on society. In this connection he develops structures for the combination of the different communication medias and for information recording.
